## The Future of NZVA Hip Dysplasia Scoring Scheme

The NZ Veterinary Association and NZ Kennel Club collaborative Hip Dysplasia Scheme is under review. The scheme was introduced in the 80's and is based on the British Kennel Club scheme often referred to as the Willis Scheme. The AVA and independent scoring schemes in Australia use the same scheme, sometimes with a addition of a subjective grade. The x-ray taken is a hip-extended view with the dog anaesthetised on its back.

The score data the NZVA/NZKC has accumulated was recently analysed to determine any trends in hip phenotype over the life of the schemes. The phenotype is the physical expression of a trait, in this case how the hips look on an x-ray. The hip data from 1989-2008 showed only marginal improvement in the German shepherd and no improvement in the other three breeds analysed (Golden Retriever, Labrador Retriever and Rottweiler)<sup>1</sup>. A similar analysis of the NZVA Elbow Scheme data showed a very positive improvement in all four breeds analysed. There are many possible contributing factors to this lack of progress and the test itself is only one of them. Lack of compulsion to score, pre-screening and poorly applied selection criteria are all likely to have lowered the potential benefit of the hip scheme. However we have seen consistent improvement in the incidence of elbow dysplasia despite these same confounding variables. A more recent analysis (unpublished data) which combined pedigree information and hip scores across generations showed very small gains in hip phenotype using estimated breeding value analysis.

This suggests that the hip-extended system we use may be a comparably poorer reflection of genotype than the guidelines we use for ED. Alternatively breeders could be applying more selection pressure for better elbows than better hips.

### So why might the test be less effective than hoped?

The extended hip view is recognised to under-estimate the degree of laxity (looseness) of the hip. It is this laxity, in young growing pups, which contributes to the abnormal loading through the hip which leads to the early onset arthritis we recognise as hip dysplasia. Whilst we have attempted to refine the NZVA HD system to better emphasize those criteria that key on laxity with the introduction of a subtotal score, a study in German Shepherds concluded that PennHIP distraction index and subtotal NZVA scores were not well correlated and the subtotal score could not be used as a surrogate for the passive laxity measured by PennHIP<sup>3</sup>.

Several studies have found that the heritability (the degree to which the parents genes affect the trait in the offspring) of traditional radiographic scoring schemes, like the NZVA scheme, is relatively low (0.2-0.4), whereas the PennHIP method, which measures passive hip laxity, has been shown to have a heritability as high as 0.6-0.8. The Companion Animal Society (CAS) of the NZVA has therefore concluded that as scientists we should recommend the current best test.

PennHIP has a lower false negative rate (dogs thought to be normal but actually affected) at detecting laxity and will allow breeders to make much more rapid genetic gains, as long as selection pressure is properly applied. CAS has proposed a change to the way we recommend hips are scored in NZ. From the start of 2014 it is proposed that the current NZVA/NZKC Hip Scheme is discontinued and the PennHIP scheme is endorsed. This could see the NZVA become the first veterinary association in the world to endorse PennHIP for its national scheme.

So what of the future of the Elbow Dysplasia scheme? It is the intention of CAS to ensure that the ED scheme remains viable - as it has been shown to be effective. This may require

restructuring from its current form. CAS is working on ways in which the PennHIP data can be captured in a NZ registry in addition to contributing to the worldwide database. Some breeders may choose to use the Australian hip-extended schemes rather than PennHIP, however that data is currently not being captured by the NVZA or NZKC. It remains imperative that the NZKC take over management of a NZ database and include the data from both PennHIP and AVA/independent schemes into a breeding value concept or utilise the planned Australasian database system being developed by the AVA.

## Hip and Elbow X-Raying through the GSDAC System.

When you choose to have your dog Hip and Elbow X rayed, you will have two schemes to choose from. Either the Penn Hip System or the German Shepherd Dog Advisory Council system.

The GSDAC is a good scheme that will provide you with a certificate that shows and indicates where any problems may exist in your dog's hips and elbows. Obviously the lower the score the better condition your dog is in. This also will give you an idea how you will exercise and train your dog over the years remaining of its life. Another insight given by the scoring GSDAC system is a guide towards breeding. Ideally, the cut off score when choosing a mate for your breeding programme is 8-8. That is eight on either hip and not more than 3 in Subluxation on either hip. If you follow these guidelines, you would expect healthy puppies.

Information is collected and collated with GSUAC and will be available for breeder's selection. As much as we care for our dogs, the GSDAC scheme will be of more suited to you because of the broader information given for your breeding programme or just for the soundness of your pet.

### Hip Dysplasia

What is hip dysplasia?

To understand hip dysplasia we must have a basic understanding of the joint that is being affected. The hip joint forms the attachment of the hind leg to the body and is a ball and socket joint. The ball portion is the head of the femur while the socket (acetabulum) is located on the pelvis. In a normal joint, the ball rotates freely within the socket. To facilitate movement the bones are shaped to perfectly match each other; with the socket surrounding the ball. To strengthen the joint, the two bones are held together by a strong ligament. The ligament attaches the femoral head directly to the acetabulum. In addition, the joint capsule, which is a very strong band of connective tissue, encircles the two bones adding further stability. The area where the bones actually touch each other is called the articular surface. It is perfectly smooth and cushioned with a layer of spongy cartilage. In addition, the joint contains a highly viscous fluid that lubricates the articular surfaces. In a dog with normal hips, all of these factors work together to cause the joint to function smoothly and with stability.

Hip dysplasia is associated with abnormal joint structure and a laxity of the muscles, connective tissue, and ligaments that would normally support the joint. As joint laxity develops, the articular surfaces of the two bones lose contact with each other. This separation of the two bones within the joint is called a subluxation.
